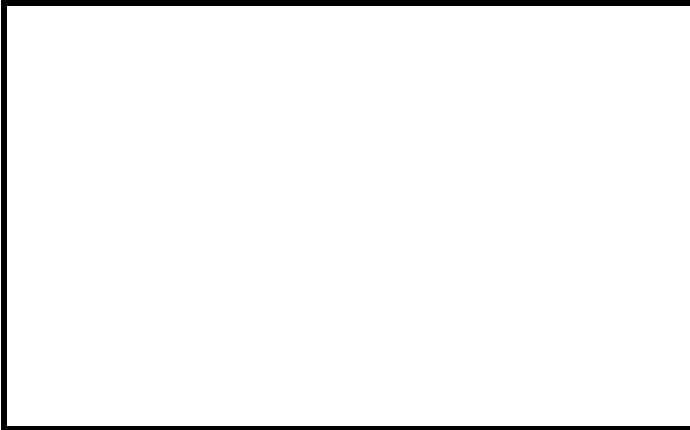
“Tax Refund Information”

PROBLEMS IN THE PARKS?

Who you gonna call?

As most Villagers are aware, there are three parks in Sheffield Village. The park at 247 Marlow Drive (the Rec. Center) is an Oakland City Park. Onset Park (the dog park) and Milford Park (the tennis court) are owned by the SVHOA.

In the event that there are any problems or “suspicious activities” in the City Park, Villagers should call either the Rec. Center director, Michelle Fulper (weekdays) or the Park Rangers (nights and weekends). Their numbers are in the “Important Phone Numbers” box on the front page of this issue.

Regarding the SVHOA parks, the Board is in the process of posting signs required by the Oakland Police Department, and is filing a formal “permission for entry” notice, which will allow the Police Department to enter these private parks if needed. So don’t be surprised (or offended) when the new signs appear - we’re simply trying to keep our commonly-owned areas safe.

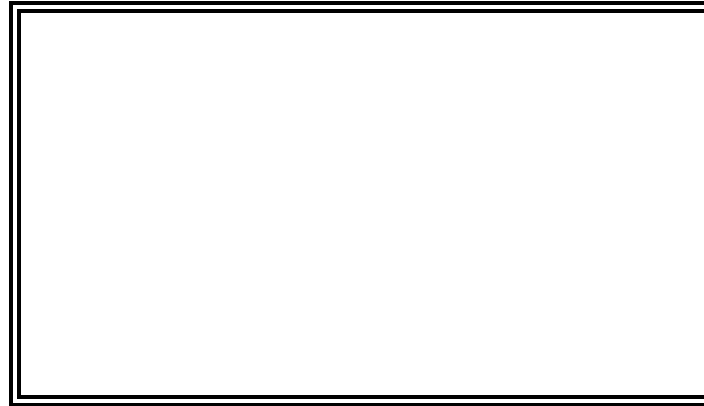
SHEFFIELD VILLAGE TO GO UNDERGROUND?

Is It Worth \$4,000 - \$5,500+ Per Home?

At the November Board meeting the owner of a Village apartment building suggested that the SVHOA petition to have our overhead utility lines replaced with an underground system.

This would require the creation of an “Underground District” for assessment purposes. The estimated cost is \$4,000 to \$5,500 per single family home. In addition, each homeowner has to prepare his/her electrical service to accept the underground system, at an average cost of \$1,000.

An Underground District would be created if a petition is signed by 60% of the owners whose property is contiguous to the new utility lines.



NOVEMBER ELECTION REPORT

About 75% of registered Village voters participated in the General Election on November 5th. There was very positive response to the new "Votamatic" Touch Screen machines.

The election poll workers were Olga Kempton (Inspector), Dorothy Davis (Judge) Kenneth Pimentel and Sharon Lewis (Clerks).

FROM YOUR SVHOA BOARD: BEFORE YOU ADD THAT ADDITION ...

Ours is a Village with a distinct, neighborly feel and character. We all bought homes here for those reasons and more. We cannot survive as a unified community with tremendous appeal if any of its homeowners are going to treat it merely as an amorphous housing tract where they can experiment with the look of their home.

Everyone in the Village was aware when they moved here that we have a homeowner's association with bylaws and CC&Rs. As Villagers, we elect a Board of Directors to represent our interests in many matters including the approval process for construction of ANY structures - fences, garages, room additions. This is a trust (and a duty) we take very seriously as SVHOA Board members.

With an apparent recent increase in unauthorized construction throughout the Village, your SVHOA Board of Directors hereby formally reserves all rights under the Village Declaration of Restrictions (including section 14, paragraph (b)), as to any construction which is deemed visually inconsistent with the character of our neighborhood or is inappropriately located on the property.

Please remember that designs for all construction projects must be submitted to the Board for approval. Those designs are required to reflect what the final construction will look like. Incomplete or evasive designs are not acceptable, and the Board reserves the right to challenge such projects after they are completed.

We live in a community where cooperation with and consideration of our neighbors is essential. Let's all try to work together to keep this the friendliest, most unified neighborhood in Oakland.
